Later that year, she moved to Houston to practice soft tissue and oncologic surgery at Gulf Coast Veterinary Specialists. Dr. Hottinger played a pivotal role in developing the highly regarded surgical internship program at GCVS and continues to serve as a program director and mentor. In addition to training interns, she teaches visiting veterinarians and veterinary students, and lectures both nationally and internationally. In recognition of her outstanding contributions to education, Dr. Hottinger was honored as the Small Animal Instructor of the Year by the WVC in 2013.

An active contributor to veterinary research, Dr. Hottinger has authored and co-authored numerous scientific papers that have advanced the field.
